Over 50 Million people are affected by dementia today! We know that a lot can be done for persons living with dementia. 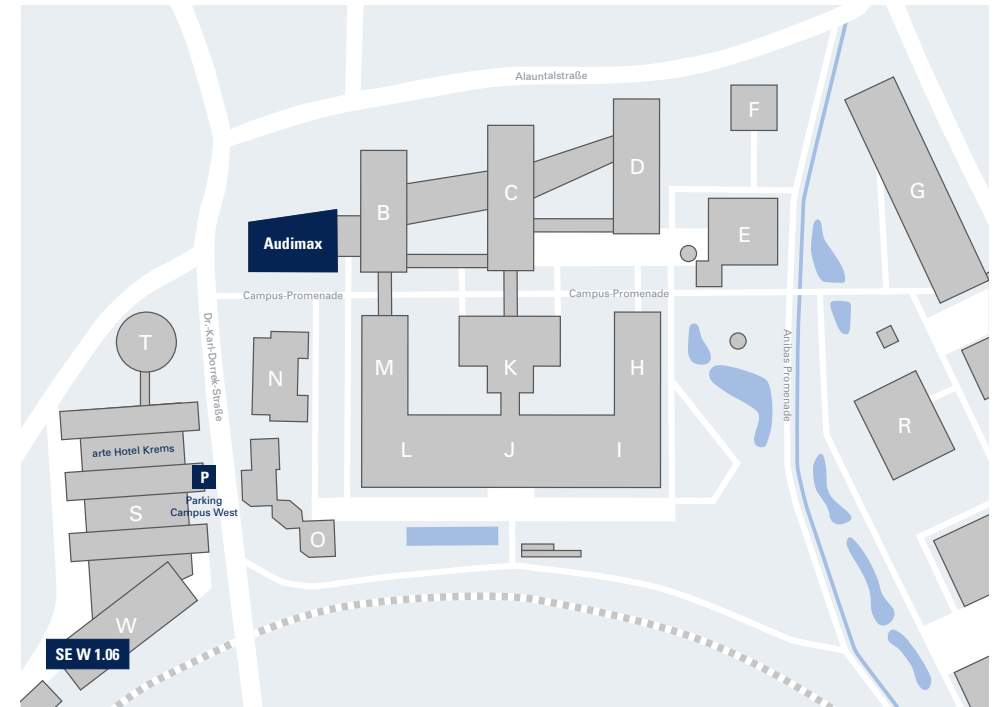
