About this programme

This programme has been developed by the European Stroke Organisation (ESO) to cover the needs for academic medical speciality training in stroke medicine throughout Europe. It aims at medical doctors, including neurologists, geriatricians and other subspecialties as well as medical doctors in training for such specialist areas.

The European Master in Stroke Medicine will focus on all fields of stroke ranging from acute diagnosis and interventions to rehabilitation and principles of neural repair. In addition, an expert research focus is maintained throughout all lectures and seminars, thus covering all aspects of basic and clinical research.

While some parts of this programme can be achieved by distance learning, four full weeks of lectures are planned on-site at the Danube-University in Krems, Austria. Structured as a part-time programme two full on-site weeks of lectures and seminars will be held per academic year.

Practical experiences will be gained at established stroke centers throughout Europe with a practicum totalling 4 weeks of hands-on experience.



Admission Requirements

Entry into the European Master in Stroke Medicine requires students to have completed a medical Doctor-degree or to be in a medical training.

Language

Due to the international formation of lecturers and students all lectures, seminars and exams will be held in English.

Programme Duration

The programme is designed for five semesters. Four semesters are held on-campus, the fifth semester should be used to complete the Master thesis.

The off-campus exercise units are composed of study time, exam preparation and distance learning. The Virtual Stroke University will support the programme by providing electronic lectures available through its website.

The on-site lectures are divided into four modules. The 4 modules of the “European Master in Stroke Medicine” will be held on the following dates:

1. Modul 07.-12. November 2016
2. Modul 03.-08. April 2017
3. Modul 16.-21. October 2017
4. Modul 09.-14. April 2018

Tuition Fee

Tuition fee for 5 semesters: EUR 12.000,-

This tuition fee includes all on-site lectures, course documents and seminars, but doesn't cover board and lodging.

Please be aware that you receive the invoice once at the beginning of your studies and you will not get any further invoices. If you choose to pay by instalments, it is important to pay all instalments on time otherwise you will be enrolled anymore and this means that you are not allowed to take any exams. This would lead to the impossibility of sitting an exam. Generally please pay the instalments for the winter-semester by October 1st and the instalments for summer-semester by March 1st.

Modules

The European Master in Stroke Medicine programme consists of four modules which are held at the Danube University Krems. Each module starts on Monday morning and usually lasts for a week until Saturday 12:00.

Each module has a topic, such as:

- Module 1: Imaging and Pathophysiology
- Module 2: Clinical Epidemiology and Prevention
- Module 3: Diagnostics and Syndromes
- Module 4: Therapeutic strategies and Neurorehabilitation

The modules are structured into sub-topics, those are called sections. Each section has a section leader who invites the speakers to give lectures in his/her section.



Lecture notes and scripts

The presentations of the lecturers will be converted into PDF files and put online into Moodle as soon as they are available to the course coordinator. Please understand that sometimes lecturers want to amend the presentation a little bit before they hand it out, and they are only online a few days after the lecture.

Evaluation of lectures

Your satisfaction is our benchmark and your opinion is highly important to us. Please help us to optimize the quality of our programme and give us your feedback to the lectures.

You will receive a link by e-mail to the evaluation tool for every lecturer. You won't need any username or pin-code. The evaluation is usually open for 2 weeks, after 1 week you will receive a reminder in case you have not evaluated the lecturer yet.

The evaluations are of course anonymous. After the 2 weeks the evaluations are sent to the lecturers directly by e-mail, we therefore ask you to comment objective but honest.

Degree requirements

To be eligible for the award of the European Master in Stroke Medicine (MSc), a student must acquire 120 ECTS as prescribed below:

- Participation in four modules:
 - Imaging and pathophysiology
 - Clinical epidemiology and prevention
 - Diagnostic and syndroms
 - Therapeutic strategies and neurorehabilitation
- Three written exams
- Oral exam
- Master thesis
- Practicum
- 30 eCME-points
 - 15 by passing VSU-questionnaires
 - Remaining CME points by International Stroke Conferences

Exams and Assessments

End of semester exams are scheduled to run on every Monday of the following module. Please see the extra sheet “Guideline Exams” for more information.

Master Thesis

The final thesis will give the student an opportunity to work on a subject concerning a sub-section of the course and thus gain specialised knowledge of the subject and to produce and present a well-founded scientific study.

Practicum

Each student needs to visit a Stroke Unit in Europe for four weeks (20 days). The practicum should be completed in at least two different units preferably out of your own country.

After your successfully completed practicum weeks, please upload your signed practicum confirmation into Moodle (practicum confirmation form can be downloaded).

Virtual Stroke University (VSU)

According to the decree on the establishment and the curriculum of the postgraduate university course “European Master in Stroke Medicine” the lectures and exams of the Virtual Stroke University are a significant part of the programme.

To complete the degree all students have to pass the exams of the Virtual Stroke University.

The ESO Virtual Stroke University <http://www.stroke-university.com/> features audio recordings synchronised with full screen slides. Visitors can therefore follow the slides exactly as they were presented at the meeting, while watching and listening to the speaker.

After gaining CME points by the VSU please upload the certificates into Moodle.

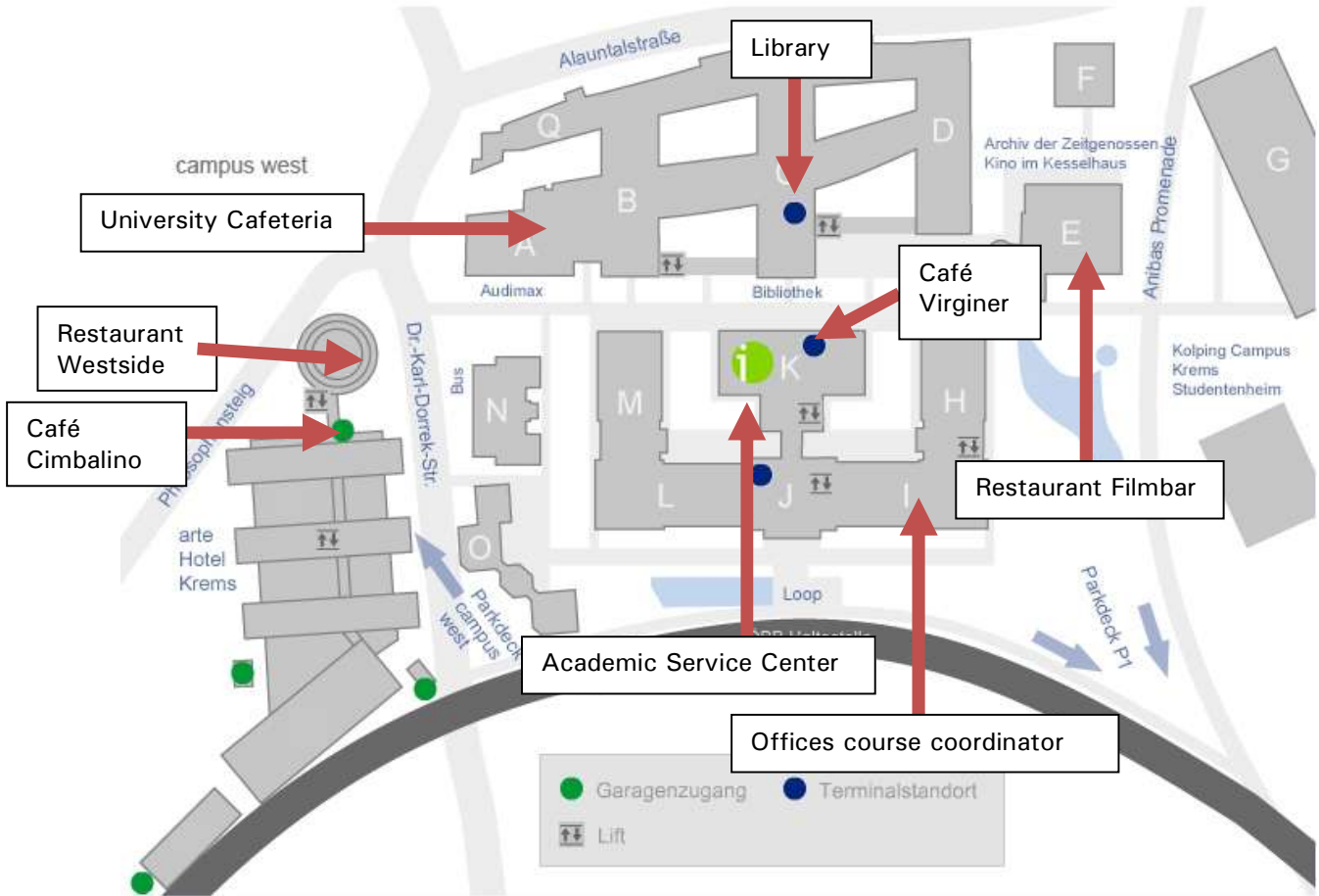
Stroke Unit Tulln
