1. Objective/s

The Hungarian Partners of Living Danube Limes project have organised a 3 days living history festival on the Hungarian Pilot Site, Százhalombatta. The festival was the part of the 'Connecting Cruise', where volunteers were travelling with a fully reconstructed 4th Century Roman Lusoria along the River Danube – from Germany to Romania. The connecting cruise had 17 stops on the territory of Hungary, where – as a Hungarian Pilot Site – Százhalombatta had an important role.

During the organisation of the festival, the Hungarian Partners, PP6 BME (Budapest University of Technology and Economics), PP17 KÖME (Association of Cultural Heritage Managers), and external expert Spatialist Ltd. had cooperations with different stakeholders: Municipality of Százhalombatta, „Matrica“ Museum and Archaeological Park of Százhalombatta, ASP János Banner Foundation of Archaeology, „Klub Sirály“ Boat House, the Cultural Centre of Százhalombatta, by this the organisers of „Summerfest“ International Folklore Festival and Folk Art Fair and local civils, reenactors. By this, the most important aim was to involve different levels of stakeholders and target groups to the event that supported the complexity of the learning interactions.

2. Target Groups

The overall aim of the organisers

- to provide a platform and authentic environment for knowledge transfers between different target groups,
- and to generate events for learning interactions by experience the different aspects of history.

6.2. Recapitulation of Organisers

The Living History event was organised with complex reasons. The first aim was to provide a platform and authentic environment for knowledge transfers between different target groups, that has realised in closed, institutionalised way (exhibition at museum) and open air in different environment (city centre, Danube shore, historical area of the Pilot Site) and to generate events for learning interactions (ceremony, parade, reenactment programmes, interpretive guided programs, art and visual programs in the line of the Connecting Cruise) by experience the different aspects of history. 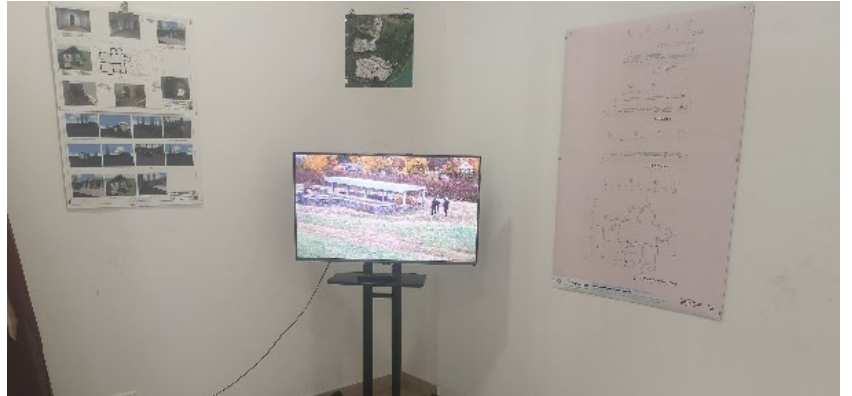
