

How to get to the conference venue (Rose Hotel Yokohama).

Yokohama is the second largest city of Japan and is located less than half an hour from Tokyo by train. Yokohama is serviced by the two international airports of Tokyo, Haneda and Narita International Airports.

HANEDA AIRPORT INFORMATION

Haneda Airport is the preferred airport, as it is closer to the venue and is situated at the southern tip of Tokyo, although the number of international flights are limited. From the venue, it is less than an hour away by the clean and comfortable Haneda Airport Limousine Bus.


FYI: Taxis are quite costly in Japan and Uber and other similar operations are still illegal.

Arriving at Haneda Airport and using the Limousine Bus: You should take the bus heading to Yamashita Park, Minato Mirai and the Red Brick Warehouse. You need to get off at the Yamashita Park bus stop and it is about five minutes by foot.

If you are arriving with a lot of heavy luggage or if it is raining, it may be more convenient to use the limousine bus heading to YCAT (fare JPY 580) and take a taxi from YCAT (approx. JPY 1500- 2000). For information about YCAT, see below.

Direct buses to Yamashita Park operate from 8:40 – 20:45 so be mindful to see that your flight will arrive between these hours if you wish to use this option. The time schedule for the limousine bus can be found at the following URL. Fares per person cost JPY 720. Ticket are available at the arrival terminal.

Heading to Haneda Airport from the venue will be easy, as there is a bus stop departing to Haneda Airport in front of the hotel.

Haneda Airport to YCAT – Yokohama City Air Terminal

If your flight arrives early or late, you can take a limousine bus to Yokohama City Air Terminal. Travel time is little over 30 minutes from Haneda to YCAT, and buses run from 5:15 to 23:40. Fares are JPY 580. They also provide late night buses hourly until 2:20 AM, although late night buses fares are increased to JPY 1030.

From Yokohama Station, you change trains for the Minato Mirai Line and get on the train heading to Motomachi Chukagai (Chinatown). The venue is 15 minutes by car from Yokohama station, therefore, taking a taxi from Yokohama may be an option. The cost of a taxi ride from Yokohama station to the Rose Hotel should be between JPY 1500 – 2000, depending on the time of traveling and/or late night surcharges.

Haneda Airport and using the trains:

Trains operate earlier and until later, but are a bit trickier to use. From Haneda Airport, you should take the Keikyu Kuuko (Airport) Line heading to Shinagawa and get off at Keikyu Kawasaki station or Keikyu Kamata station, change trains to the Keikyu Honsen outbound (heading to Kurihama or other outbound destination) and get off at Yokohama station. From Yokohama Station, you change trains for the Minato Mirai Line and get on the train heading to Motomachi Chukagai (Chinatown).

NARITA AIRPORT INFORMATION

Narita Airport is also accessible, although it is located further away and will require more travel time to access the venue. Many of the LCCs heading to Tokyo land in Narita along with more airlines, therefore Narita Airport may be more convenient for many. Traveling time from Narita Airport to the venue is approximately 110 minutes.

YCAT – Yokohama City Air Terminal

The easiest way to access the venue is to take the Airport Limousine Bus from Narita to Yokohama City Air Terminal (YCAT). The cost is JPY 3600 and the bus ride should be about 90 minutes. Buses run from 7:05 – 22:25. Tickets are available at the arrival terminal. You can view the bus schedule from the following URL and also download a PDF version as well.

The Rose Hotel Yokohama is located conveniently one minute from the Motomachi Chukagai Station of the Minato Mirai Line. It is located in the heart of the largest tourist attraction of Yokohama, Chinatown. The Yokohama Chinatown is a safe and vibrant area that showcases many upscale Chinese restaurants, aquariums and amusement facilities. Among these attractions, is the top rated Chungking Chinese Szechwan Restaurant that is located in and operated by the venue hotel. The Akai Kutsu (Red Shoe) bus that stops in front of the hotel connects guests to many attractions of Yokohama.
